



Growing healthy orchids can become a costly venture. Media, fertilizers, and preventative and curative chemicals are items that add to expense. I would rather spend that money on NEW PLANTS and I am sure you would too.

There are some household items that can help with your ventures.

- -- Aspirin can be used to protect your orchids from fungal and viral infections. It can be used as a spray dissolved in water not to exceed 3/4 of one full strength 325mg aspirin per gallon.
- --Active fungal infections can be treated by applying powdered cinnamon directly to the wound.
- --Hydrogen peroxide works as both an antifungal and an antibacterial. It can be poured directly on crown rot or other damaged areas. It can even help rot on phalaenopsis leaves, despite their consistency. It is great for cleaning any cutting tools or utensils that come in contact with unhealthy plants. I keep a small container with my supplies and dip my tools between uses to avoid cross contamination.
- --Neosporin ointment can be a good deterrent after any rot removal or necessary "surgery". It also seems to help with healing.
- --Rubbing alcohol can be your friend, as well. Full strength, in a spray bottle, it can be used to treat most insect pests. It must contact the insect to do the job and is ineffective once it dries. To create a slightly longer lasting homemade insecticide, you can use a mixture of 409 spray cleaner and alcohol (one pint of each) mixed with water to make 1 gallon.

--Grooming your growing area can help to keep your growing environment pest free. Instead of herbicides, full strength vinegar can be used as a substitute to kill weeds that become invasive on greenhouse floors and around

INTRODUCING OUR AUGUST SPEAKER




After a year of planning and design with input from many talented people, our AOS sticker book is out for publication. Laura Newton came up with the idea, and it was passed onto the Education Committee for development. I thought it was a fantastic way to engage youth and teach them about orchids.

The sticker book is 16 black and white pages printed on coloring book paper. It has 51 full-color stickers on pages inserted in the back. We chose seven of the more common orchid genera to include in this book: *Phalaenopsis, Cattleya, Cymbidium, Oncidium, Vanda*, and *Dendrobium*. Each genus is introduced on one page with some basic information and fun facts. A second page is included for each genus for coloring and more stickers.


There is a QR Code for each genus that links back to each respective Culture Sheet on the AOS

website. This will not only provide more information on genus care, but it will take the reader to AOS website to see what else we have to offer.

I'm very excited to announce that the books went to the printer in July and should be available for purchase sometime in August. 
